**CALL TO ORDER**

**ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION**

- CPS09/05 - 29 It was moved by Snider, supported by Engle, to waive the hiring freeze and allow the Circuit Court, Family Division to fill the vacant Account Clerk II position, #G02014. *MOTION CARRIED.*
- CPS09/05 - 30 It was moved by Engle, supported by Nash, to authorize the Prosecutor to apply for the FY 2010 Crime Victims Rights grant from the Michigan Department of Community Health, for the purpose of continuing funding for the Crime Victims Rights Unit of the Prosecutor's Office, in the amount of \$160,577. *MOTION CARRIED.*
- CPS09/05 - 31 It was moved by Engle, supported by Snider, to grant permission for the Sheriff's Office to do an RFP for inmate health care and pharmacy services. *MOTION CARRIED.*

CPS09/05 - 32      It was moved by Collins, supported by Engle, to authorize the Sheriff's Office to accept the Marine Safety Grant for equipment in the amount of \$7,000 for January 1, 2009 to September 30, 2009 and amend the budget accordingly. *MOTION CARRIED.*

CPS09/05 - 33      It was moved by Nash, supported by Snider, to grant permission to the Sheriff's Office to purchase a 2006 PWC from Harbor Sports for \$7,002.00. *MOTION CARRIED.*
