INTRODUCTION

The following pages contain the history of Muskegon County government for the year 1952.

The various department heads are to be commended for their cooperation in supplying financial and statistical data.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

From a financial standpoint, the condition of the County government has improved. While \$400,000 was borrowed from local banks in 1951 to finance operations, only \$250,000 was needed in 1952. At the end of 1951 the cash balance of the General Fund bank account was \$14,299.17, while the balance of this same account at the end of 1952 was \$68,110.67. This means that the net indebtedness of the County was reduced from \$385,700.83 at the end of 1951 to \$181,889.33 at the end of 1952.

The reduction in the debt was due in part to increased income in 1952. Of greater importance was the reduction of expenditures last year.

Efforts at control of expenditures appear to be justified when the record for 1952 is compared with that for 1951. This comparison is made in the following illustration:

In 1951 the appropriations for fifteen items in the budget were overdrawn. The total amount of the budget overdraft as shown above was \$81,829.72. In 1952 the appropriations for only five items in the budget were overdrawn. There were enough savings in other items to offset the amount of these overdrafts and the year ended with a net saving on the entire budget appropriation of \$30,471.98.

COMPARISON OF EXPENDITURES WITH BUDGET, Continued

In 1952, the budget overdraft of 1951 (\$81,829.72) was not only eliminated, but an additional saving of \$30,471.98 was effected. Thus, it might fairly be said that the total saving in 1952 was the sum of these two amounts or \$112,301.70.

To keep expenditures within the limits as set up in a budget is the first desirable goal of those who shoulder the financial responsibilities of government. This first objective appears to have been achieved in 1952.

The second major target is to keep the amount of planned expenditures within the limits of anticipated revenue. This is popularly referred to as "balancing the budget." This second objective appears to be within reach.

RECOMMENDATION FOR 1953

The controller respectfully suggests the following steps to effect future savings.

1. Action by the Board on the report of the Special Rules Committee to avoid duplication of work by the different committees. Expenditures for the work of the Board and its committees in 1952 were \$17,300.91 as compared to \$21,905.76 in 1951. The reduction in this expense was \$4,604.85 in one year or 21% of the 1951 total.

2. The establishment of a policy in regard to the placing of county insurance business. Some consideration might be given to the placing of part of the insurance with large mutual companies and other dividend-paying companies. A conservative estimate of saving here would be about 15% of premium cost. Several agencies of local government are taking advantage of this possible saving by placing their insurance with mutual companies.

The county could well afford to be self-insurer as far as protection against fire hazard is concerned on all properties not exceeding \$10,000 in value. It is unlikely that all such properties would be destroyed at the same time.

3. Approval of a plan to allow the controller to study the operation of the various departments with a view to improve service to the public and reduce cost where practical.

CONCLUSION

Adoption of any of the above proposals should improve efficiency of operation and reduce cost to the taxpayer.

Any criticism or suggestion for improving the content or format of the annual report will be welcomed.



THE FOREGOING IS A BRIEF GENERAL ACCOUNT AND SUMMARY OF THE MORE IMPORTANT ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT DURING THE PAST YEAR.

THE NEED FOR DIRECT RELIEF THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY HAS BEEN AT THE LOWEST LEVEL IN SEVERAL YEARS. THIS REFLECTS THE UNUSUALLY GOOD EMPLOYMENT CONDITIONS WHICH HAVE PREVAILED. WHILE OUR DIRECT RELIEF COST PER CASE HAS INCREASED FROM \$43.55 IN 1951 TO \$47.06 IN 1952, OUR TOTAL NET COSTS WERE REDUCED APPROXIMATELY \$12,000.00 FOR THE YEAR. THE INCREASED CASE COST HAS RESULTED FROM SEVERAL DIFFERENT FACTORS NAMELY - FOOD ALLOWANCE INCREASES AND HOUSING.

THE CRIPPLED AND AFFLICTED ADULT HOSPITALIZATION COSTS FOR THE COUNTY WERE MATERIALLY REDUCED LAST YEAR. TWO FACTORS WHICH HAVE CONTRIBUTED TO THE REDUCTION ARE THE USE BEING MADE OF THE COUNTY CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL FACILITIES AND OUR OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT AT THE HOSPITAL. IN MANY INSTANCES, PATIENTS CONTACTING THE OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT HAVE BEEN HOSPITALIZED IMMEDIATELY AT OUR OWN INSTITUTION, SAVING THE EXPENSE OF HAVING THEM ADMITTED TO PRIVATE HOSPITALS. PRIVATE HOSPITAL CASES ADMITTED FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT OR CASES NEEDING CONVALESCENT CARE NOW CAN BE CARED FOR AT THE COUNTY HOSPITAL WHICH HAS HELPED TO REDUCE THESE COSTS. A COMPARISON OF FIGURES APPEARS TO BE RATHER SIGNIFICANT. IN 1951 WE PAID FOR 5,996 PRIVATE HOSPITAL DAYS AT A TOTAL COST OF \$84,113.21. IN 1952 THERE WERE 3,843 HOSPITAL DAYS AT A TOTAL COST OF \$57,594.19 OR A DECREASE OF \$26,519.02. PATIENTS ADMITTED AND DISCHARGED AT THE COUNTY CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL SHOW A DECIDED INCREASE OVER 1951. IN 1951 WE ADMITTED 151 PATIENTS AND DISCHARGED 139. IN 1952 WE ADMITTED 302 PATIENTS AND DISCHARGED 274 OR AN INCREASE OF NEARLY 100% OVER THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

TO FURTHER SECURE THE COUNTY FOR MONIES SPENT IN THE ADULT HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAM, TRUST DEEDS ARE NOW BEING TAKEN WHERE THERE IS PROPERTY. THIS PRACTICE WENT INTO EFFECT ABOUT MARCH 1 1952. TO DATE WE HAVE 55 TRUST DEEDS ON FILE, OF THIS NUMBER 2 HAVE BEEN RELEASED AS ACCOUNTS HAVE BEEN PAID IN FULL. A LARGER VOLUME OF COLLECTIONS SHOULD BE FORTHCOMING FROM THIS SOURCE IN THE FUTURE AS ESTATES ARE SETTLED, ETC.

FROM APRIL 14 TO DECEMBER 31 1952, A TOTAL OF 596 PATIENTS WERE SEEN AT OUR OUTPATIENT DEPARTMENT. THIS IS A COMPARATIVELY NEW PROGRAM AND OUR EXPERIENCE WITH IT HAS BEEN SO LIMITED ACTUAL FIGURES ARE NOT AVAILABLE. IT IS FELT, HOWEVER, IT SHOULD EFFECT A CONSIDERABLE SAVINGS TO THE COUNTY AND GIVE A SERVICE TO MANY RECIPIENTS WHICH PREVIOUSLY HAS NOT BEEN AVAILABLE TO THEM.

DUE TO THE INCREASED DEMANDS MADE OF OUR FACILITIES AT THE COUNTY HOSPITAL, WE HAVE FOUND IT NECESSARY TO EXPAND THIS PROGRAM TO INCLUDE THE FIRST FLOOR AS A HOSPITAL UNIT. BY UTILIZING ALL AVAILABLE SPACE IN THE BUILDING, WE NOW HAVE A TOTAL BED CAPACITY OF 150. WE HAVE A STATIC PATIENT POPULATION OF APPROXIMATELY 135. TO FURTHER BREAK DOWN THIS FIGURE, IT SHOWS THE FOLLOWING - 115 HOSPITAL PATIENTS AND 20 AMBULATORY PATIENTS - WHICH LEAVES ONLY 15 BEDS FOR EMERGENCY AND PRIVATE HOSPITAL CONVALESCENT CASES.

WE HAVE NOTED DURING THE PAST YEAR AN EVER INCREASING NEED FOR HOUSING THE EMERGENCY MENTALLY ILL OR DISTURBED PATIENT WHO IS AWAITING TRANSFER TO A MENTAL INSTITUTION. THE COUNTY HAS NO FACILITIES FOR THE CARE OF THESE PEOPLE AND WE HAVE FREQUENT REQUESTS FROM OTHER COUNTY DEPARTMENTS TO GIVE TEMPORARY CARE OF THIS TYPE. IN DEALING WITH THE TYPE AND AGE GROUP OF PATIENTS WE HAVE AT THE COUNTY HOSPITAL, WE ARE CONSTANTLY CONFRONTED WITH THIS PROBLEM ALSO. IT IS NOT UNUSUAL TO HAVE SEVERAL SUCH PATIENTS AT THE HOSPITAL AT ONE TIME. THE CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL AS IT IS SET UP IS NEITHER EQUIPPED NOR CAN WE LEGALLY HOUSE PSYCHOTIC PATIENTS ACCORDING TO THE STATE'S LICENSING PROCEDURE UNDER WHICH WE OPERATE AT THE PRESENT TIME. IF SEPARATE QUARTERS COULD BE PROVIDED, THERE WOULD PROBABLY BE NO OBJECTION.

THIS INFORMATION IS BEING SUBMITTED TO BETTER ACQUAINT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WITH SOME OF THE ACTIVITIES, PROBLEMS AND NEEDS OF THE COMMUNITY IN THE WELFARE FIELD AS THEY EXIST TODAY.

INTRODUCTIONANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1952
MUSKEGON COUNTY BUREAU OF SOCIAL AID

AS THE FUNCTIONS OF OUR AGENCY ARE VERY CLOSELY ALLIED TO THOSE OF THE MUSKEGON COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE, WE ARE PROVIDING A BRIEF SUMMARY OF OUR ACTIVITIES FOR THE PAST YEAR.

OUR CASE LOADS HAVE CONTINUED TO DECLINE. APPARENTLY THE REASONS FOR THIS ARE IMPROVED ECONOMIC CONDITIONS AND THE INCREASED PAYMENTS BEING MADE UNDER SOCIAL SECURITY.

DURING THE PAST YEAR YOUR COUNTY SOCIAL WELFARE BOARD SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE SOCIAL WELFARE COMMISSION WHEREBY WE NOW PAY DIRECTLY TO THE COUNTY DEPARTMENT THE WARRANTS FOR OUR RECIPIENTS WHO ARE HOSPITALIZED THROUGH THAT DEPARTMENT.

THE PAYMENTS TO RECIPIENTS IN THE COUNTY CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL HAVE INCREASED FROM 46 OLD AGE ASSISTANCE AND 5 AID TO THE DISABLED IN DECEMBER 1951 TO 71 OLD AGE ASSISTANCE AND 9 AID TO THE DISABLED IN DECEMBER 1952. THIS HAS MEANT AN INCREASE FROM \$3 780.50 IN DECEMBER 1951 TO PAYMENTS OF \$ 6 642.50 FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER 1952.
